



## Adapté à des exigences particulières : Molsheim adapte l'eEconic au marché australien



**Wörth (Allemagne)/Molsheim (France)** - Mercedes-Benz Custom Tailored Trucks (CTT), le département de Mercedes-Benz Trucks chargé des transformations personnalisées, accueille actuellement un invité rare. Là où les véhicules de la série A, c'est-à-dire les Actros, Arocs et Atego, sont transformés la plupart du temps, l'équipe de Molsheim travaille actuellement sur une solution personnalisée pour le Mercedes-Benz eEconic afin de permettre à une entreprise australienne de traitement des déchets de passer à l'e-mobilité. L'eEconic modifié est l'un des dix véhicules de ce type destinés au marché australien.

La raison de cette conversion est que les réglementations nationales en matière d'homologation diffèrent souvent pour chaque pays, et en particulier en Australie. Avec la gamme eEconic produite dans l'usine allemande Wörth-am-Rhein, les entreprises australiennes de traitement des déchets ne peuvent pas utiliser la charge utile maximale en raison de principes de calcul différents. En Australie comme en Europe, des valeurs spécifiques pour le poids brut maximal du véhicule s'appliquent pour l'immatriculation, en fonction de la configuration des essieux. Toutefois, les valeurs appliquées en Australie

En passant d'un essieu suiveur simple à un essieu suiveur double, l'eEconic converti pour le marché australien peut transporter trois tonnes de charge utile en plus. Pour que les véhicules soient adaptés à l'Australie et à ses opérations avec des conteneurs à déchets, l'empattement a également été allongé, passant des quatre mètres standard à 4,6 mètres.
